




Coexist

The three break lights goes on an off.



Spray paint, plaster of Paris bandage, asphalted paper for roof, plastic cups, metal, chicken wire, PVC foam, Styrofoam . Pedestal; metal and concrete.

Sculpture, 2010
65cm high, 23,5 cm wide, 65 cm long.
Metal, towel hooks, asphalted paper for roof, spray paint (gold), screws

Day Night Urzeit

Sculpture, 2009

242 cm high, 517 cm long (from arm to arm), 140 cm wide. Each block 117 cm wide-without the lamp and arm-242 cm

Asphalted paper for roof, feathers, 17 table fans, PVC pipes, 4 headlights from cars, 4 light bulbs, electric cables, black plastic, metal, roof lacquer, sanded paper for roof, thread, wood board, metal wire, chicken wire, metal foil, Styrofoam.

The sculpture consists of two blocks. Each block has an inside and an outside. On the outside there is an arm, if it would be stretched it would be about 200 cm long, it is bended and it holds a lamp stand, 140 cm high, which has two car headlights on the top. The light goes on and off every 12 seconds. There are 12 seconds of light and 12 seconds of no light. All lamps are synchronized. The surface on the outside is asphalted paper, burned and melted. Asphalted papers made into braids are laid over the arms and the surface, sometimes more visible, sometimes more dissolved. The sides, the top and the base are flattened, as if the blocks have been cut out from a bigger piece. The material of the sides are sanded paper, covered with lacquer for roofing. The two insides are standing opposite to each other. They are not mirrored.

You are supposed to stand between the two blocks; you can walk through the sculpture. The surface of the inside is covered with black feathers and all 17 black table fans are blowing so the feathers move. The engines of the table fans are making a quite loud noise. There is a figure, or a place where a figure has been-like a fossil-divided with segmented bones/ribs. The figure is shown from feet to the head, it has no arms. The figure, or the place where the figure has been is not covered with black feathers, it is covered with black tape and black pipes covered with tape.





The sculpture looks like a tree and is 10 m long. The tree has fallen and therefore the roots are visible. There is a figure, larger than normal size and strongly built inside the root system. The figure belongs to the tree and is covered with plastic and black tape in the same way as the roots. The trunk is covered with black plastic and transparent tape. Everything that is usually visible (the ground that we stand on, the trunk, the branches) has this glittery surface.

The sculpture has two sides, above the ground (trunk, branches, glittery surface) and below the ground (roots, soil, figure, feathers). Since the tree has fallen, the root system, which normally cannot be seen, is displayed.

The height of the root part is 280 cm and 400 cm wide. The root systems consist of the soil which feathers are attached to. The feathers are moving, due to table fans integrated in the roots. The ventilators create a buzzing sound. The wind makes the feathers move and this create "activity". The activity is there to emphasize that it is in the root part that the change has taken place. The figure is flexible, it got long arms, legs and is surrounded by roots and soil. The figure sucks its own toe. The figure did not crawl into the roots after the tree fell; it was there from the beginning.

Rootfilling I

Sculpture, 2007. Documentation from Bildmuseet. 10 m long (the root part is 280 cm high and 400 cm wide).

Wood, metal, adhesive tape, plastic foil, black feathers, 5 ventilators, transparent tape, PVC pipes, steel wire, chicken wire.





Portraits and Repetition I (to the right)

Sculpture, 2009

100 cm high, 38 cm long, 48 cm wide. Pedestal: $36.2 \times 36 \times 18.6 \text{ cm}$.

Chicken wire, PVC pipes, PVC foam, rubber tube, plastic cups, plaster of Paris bandage, asphalted paper for roof, spray paint.



Timer

Sculpture, 2008


Approximately 1,8 m high and 2,5 m wide .

Timer, inner tubes from truck tyres, plastic foil, metal construction, rubber, thread, car headlight, cables, light bulbs, wood board, PVC foam, PVC pipes, tape, rubber glue.

A pile of inner tubes from Trucks (rubber) creates a "body". Four big arms grow out of the pile. The muscles are exaggerated. They bend their elbows a bit. In their hands, each of them hold a car headlight, which is placed on a black metal lamp stand. A timer placed inside the "rubber pile body" makes the light go on and off every 10 seconds. So it will be 10 seconds of light, 10 seconds of no light.







Knochenbruch

Sculpture, 2006
Adhesive tape, cardboard, plastic foil, feathers, 11 ventilators, nylon string, PVC pipes, steel wire, bubble wrap, wood.



Home Tunnel

Sculpture inside a house, 2005 Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam.

Home Tunnel is taking up all space inside a house. The furniture, the interior, is made impossible to use. The sofa has knives attached to it, the table has bamboo sticks covering the tabletop. A net, knives and toothpicks cover the bed. The mirror in the bathroom has racer blades on the surface, the TV screen has sharp tools knitted to it. The shelves are filled up with bricks and bamboo. The visitors step into the house and they walk around inside the sculpture.
